Revenue requirements and rates for 2023, 2024 and 2025

Proceeding 27844 Corix Utilities (Foothills Water) Inc.

The Alberta Utilities Commission, the independent utilities regulator, will be considering Corix Utilities (Foothills Water) Inc.'s application for revenue requirements and rates for 2023, 2024 and 2025, beginning with interim rates for January 1, 2023, to ensure that the delivery of Alberta's utility service takes place in a manner that is fair, responsible and in the public interest. If you feel you may be affected by this application, you can provide input to the AUC to review before it makes its decision.

Corix Utilities has filed an application requesting approval for revenue requirements and approval of rates for 2023, 2024 and 2025, beginning with interim rates for January 1, 2023. It also seeks approval of a bulk water rate schedule and housekeeping amendments to the tariff.

Public information session and utility presentation

The AUC will be hosting a public information session:

- **Date and time:** Tuesday, February 7, 2023, at 6 p.m.
- **Location:** De Winton Community Hall, 114 Macleod Trail E, De Winton, Alberta

The AUC will discuss how the regulatory process works and how to participate in the proceeding. Following the AUC presentation, Corix Utilities representatives will be available to answer questions about their application.

Written submissions are due February 14, 2023.

The AUC encourages customers to identify others with similar interests or positions and coordinate their intervention in the proceeding. **Joint submissions from multiple customers working together are preferred.**

To register your concerns, or your support for the application, please visit the AUC website and log in to the eFiling System to file your submission for Proceeding 27844. If you do not have access to the internet, send your name, address, phone number, organization you are representing, description of your interest in the proceeding, position including information in support of the position and reasons why the AUC should decide in the manner recommended, and whether further process is required. If no written submissions are received, the Commission may make its decision without further notice or process.

Register to participate by filing a statement of intent to participate (SIP), which should include the following:

- The proceeding number in the subject line.
- The person's (or organization) name, address, telephone number and email address.
- Description of the nature of your interest in the proceeding.
- An explanation of your position, including information in regard to your concerns with, or support for, the application.
- A list of any issues with the application that you wish to file evidence on. Evidence must include technical analysis of an issue, not just restating the customer's position on that issue.

A customer's SIP is the first opportunity to provide your position on the application. The AUC will review SIPs and then ask written questions (information requests) of the applicant based on issues identified by AUC staff and in customer SIPs. Customers will then also have the opportunity to ask information requests and provide their final position on the application as argument. Customers will only have the opportunity to file evidence if they requested that in their SIPs.

Any information and/or materials you provide as part of an AUC proceeding, except information granted confidentiality, will become part of the public record and will be posted to the AUC's electronic filing system. This includes personal information, such as your name, address and any other personal information you provide.

Who is the Alberta Utilities Commission?

- The AUC is an independent, quasi-judicial utilities regulator that is responsible to ensure that customers receive safe and reliable utility service at just and reasonable rates.
